The Statistical Journal is a quarterly published by IOS for the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UN/ECE). A Principal Subsidiary Body of the UN/ECE, the Conference of European Statisticians has worked for almost 30 years on the full range of problems of concern to national statistical services. International meetings organized by the Conference provide opportunities for in-depth discussions of organizational models or methodological solutions. The aim of the Journal is three-fold: to inform the professional world of statisticians of the work of the Conference; to establish a forum for critical discussion of the entire range of organizational, methodological, analytical or conceptual problems facing statistical services; and, to facilitate the maintenance of high quality in the future work of the Conference of European Statisticians.

The Journal publishes articles related to the work programme of the Conference, covering five major areas: regional statistical cooperation; organization and operation of statistical services; development and harmonization of economic statistics; development and harmonization of social and demographic statistics; and, development and harmonization of environment and related statistics. Each issue of the Journal usually contains a mix of articles from these areas. However, on occasion, an entire issue may deal with one area of statistics only.

Furthermore, the Journal now includes news from national and international statistical offices.
