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## More about the survey

### Who uses the answers and how?

To avoid asking more questions than necessary, we will supplement your answers with data already available at Statistics Sweden. This includes data about gender, age, your education and employment, where you live and were born, immigration, your household, and income and compensation.

Once Statistics Sweden has collected the answers, we compile them to statistics in the form of tables and figures. Statistics Sweden's statistics are used primarily by the government, authorities and other organizations. Statistics Sweden may use the data to produce other statistics. The data may also be disclosed to researchers or others who produce statistics. Such research and statistical activities are also subject to statistical confidentiality (see below).

To enable follow-ups with register data and/or a new survey, Statistics Sweden creates serial numbers that are linked to the personal identity numbers of those who participate in the survey. This link will be saved separately from survey responses and register data and will be deleted when the follow-up and/or the new survey is completed.

### How are your answers protected?

When the information is presented, no single individual can be identified.

Information about an individual's personal and economic conditions is held confidential at Statistics Sweden and all those who work on the survey are bound by professional secrecy. Confidentiality applies under Chapter 24, Section 8 of the Public Access to Information and Secrecy Act (2009:400).

### How is personal data processed?

Statistics Sweden is the controller of personal data that is processed by Statistics Sweden.

Your personal data will be processed in accordance with the EU General Data Protection Regulation, the Official Statistics Act (2001:99), the Official Statistics Ordinance (2001:100) as well as other prevailing legislation.

Statistics Sweden's legal basis for processing your personal data is that the processing is necessary for performing a task of public interest (producing statistics). You have the right to obtain a copy, in the form of a register extract, of the personal data processed about you by Statistics Sweden. Go to [www.scb.se/registerutdrag](https://www.scb.se/registerutdrag). You also have the right to have your personal data deleted in certain circumstances.

If you are dissatisfied with how your personal data is processed, you have the right to lodge a complaint with the Swedish Authority for Privacy Protection.

### Telephone interview

The interviews are recorded, and in some cases a colleague listens in on the interview, but only subject to your approval. We use listening in as a method to help improve our questionnaires and interview methods.

All interview recordings are deleted within four weeks. Recordings are protected under the Public Access to Information and Secrecy Act and the EU General Data Protection Regulation (see also Section "How are your answers protected?")
